

## WHY HPV VACCINATION MATTERS?

The Power of Prevention: Why It Matters  
for Your Students



### Key Information Points (Bullet Points):

- What is HPV? (Brief, non-alarming explanation)
- How does it spread? (Common, not just sexually transmitted)
- The Importance of Early Vaccination (Optimal protection at this age)
- Safety & Efficacy (Backed by health organizations)

**Teacher's Role:** Teachers are trusted messengers and can provide accurate information.

## ENGAGING GIRLS & PARENTS



### Toolkit Components (Brief Descriptions):

Fact Sheets & FAQs: For teachers and to send home to parents.

Conversation Starters: Age-appropriate ways to introduce the topic in class.

Lesson Plan Ideas: Short, engaging activities that integrate health education.

Parent Communication Templates: Letters, emails, and consent forms.

Poster Templates: Visually appealing posters for classrooms or school hallways.

Links to Trusted Resources: WHO, CDC, local health authority websites.

"Myth Busters" Section: Address common misconceptions.
